He named the college after the great social reformer and founder of the Arya Samaj - "Maharshi Dayanand Saraswati"

(12th Feb. 1825 – 30th Oct. 1883)

The well known socio-religious reformer and founder of the Arya Samaj, Swami Dayanand Saraswati was born in the village of Tankara – Kathiawar in Gujarat State. He was a shivbhakta and whilst performing pooja and havan on "Mahashivaratri" day, he got 'enlightenment'. College celebrates 'Mahashivaratri' as 'Rishibodh Day'. He rejected idol worship, rigidity of the caste system and rituals. His slogan was 'back to the Vedas' – Hinduism in its pristine form to be followed and also believed in the upliftment of the downtrodden.

Junior college aims at all round development of students in Academics, cultural, NCC, NSS, Sports, English Speaking and overall personality development. Junior college sets the platform for students to pursue higher studies.

SENIOR COLLEGE

Our senior college offers tremendous scope for higher studies in the fields of Arts, Science and Commerce with graduation and post-graduation level of studies in all faculties. We have a number of Ph.D. guides for all faculties. We have vocational courses in commerce like Banking & Insurance, Financial Markets and in media like BMM.

ADMISSION

1. The college has "**Linguistic minority status (Punjabi Linguistic)**" applicable to students belonging to this minority status. Admission will be given on priority basis to the students of minority status with valid proof.
2. Student who have passed the secondary school certificate of the Maharashtra State Board or equivalent boards are eligible for admission to the FYJC. Admission to the FYJC will be through the process as per government directives on the basis of availability of seats.
3. Students from other states or other boards (CBSC, IB, IGSC, ICSE) those who have passed examination other than that of the Maharashtra state board will have to fill the prescribed provisional eligibility form to obtain eligibility certificate from the HSC Board. The eligibility form must be submitted along with the college admission form. Other documents needed are, SSC mark sheet, school leaving certificate and passing certificate (original and attested copies).
4. Statement of marks and certificate to be produced at the time of admission should be self attested
5. Female students must attach copies of their ration card along with the admission form for concession in fees.
6. Student belonging to the economically backward class must submit the "**INCOME CERTIFICATE**" duly signed by the competent authority along with the admission form.
7. A student belonging to any reserved category (SC, ST, OBC, VJ/NT, etc.), the scheduled caste. Scheduled tribe, backward class and other backward classes must produce the original **CASTE CERTIFICATE** and submit the attested copies along with the admission form.

8. Admission to the SYJC classes will be first given to the students of this college. They must seek admission within ONE WEEK from the DATE OF DECLARATION OF FYJC RESULTS.
9. Admission to SYJC classes will be granted to students who do not belong to this college based on Merit (subject to availability of seats). A student must produce FYJC mark sheet, leaving certificate, along with the admission form a NO OBJECTION CERTIFICATE from the head of the institution / principal of the college last attended must be produced.

REFUND OF FEES

1. If a student informs the institution **before the commencement** of the academic year that he/she wants to withdraw his/her admission and that he/she cannot continue his/her education in the same institution for any valid reason, then tuition fees, laboratory fees (if any) and library and laboratory deposits if any, will be refunded in full however the admission fee shall be retained by the institution.
2. If a student desires to withdraw his/her admission **after the commencement** of the academic year the institution shall retain the admission fee, term fee & laboratory fees (if any) in full and also the proportionate amount of the tuition fees till the end of the month in which the refund is claimed. The remaining amount of tuition fee if any shall be refunded along with library and laboratory deposits.

APPRENTICESHIPS :

After H.S.C. completion Apprenticeships (Jobs) are available for duration of 1 to 3 yrs with a stipend of ₹.5,000/- to 7,000/- in Multinational firms, Banks and Govt. undertakings (3000 to 4000 vacancies).

Environment education and Health and physical education are compulsory subjects for all MCVC courses.

Those students desirous to join senior college can take admission in FYBA and FYBSc (subject to the approval of Mumbai University)

They can also work as distributor of various laboratory reagent chemicals, culture media, etc. They can get a job of Phlebotomist in various reputed laboratories & hospitals.

COLLEGE OFFICE

The college office is situated on the ground floor. Fees and other payments are received by the office at notified time. For scholarships, freship, railway concession, etc. office should be contacted.

COLLEGE LIBRARY

The library is in a separate building in the quadrangle at the rear of the college. Our Library supports and caters to the academic needs of our students. The College endeavours to make the library user friendly. We extend our library services to retired teachers & ex-students with minimal fees. It is equipped with 44,332 Books & 85 Periodicals in various disciplines. The large spacious reading room with an open access system encourage students to browse through a large variety of books. - Suggestions / feedback by students are welcome through library website, which will help to improve the library services.
- The library and reading room is open on all the working days from 8.00 a.m to 7.30 p.m.
- The library staff help the students to access a book.
- The library staff assist the students for use of OPAC (online public access catalogue any time.)
- Books are issued to students for a period of 7 days.
- Failure to return a book on the scheduled date will incur a fine of Re.1.00 per day beyond the due date.
- Online journals are also available in the library.
- Photocopy service is also provided to the students at the rate of Rs. 1/- per Copy.
- Readers can search the library books on the computer with the help of the library staff.
- Library is stocked with CD ROMs on various subjects.
- Internet facility is available in the library. Colour/black & white printouts will be available on payment of charge.

- Online entry is a must for internet usage.
- Reference books will not be issued in any case.
- Bags or personal books are not permitted in the reading room. Student must Keep their belongings in the luggage rack.
- Journals and personal books are not allowed inside the library.
- Visit the library website regularly for latest updates.
- Silence must be maintained. Students found chatting in the reading room will face disciplinary action.
- Library is under CCTV surveillance.
- If any book is damaged or lost by the borrower he/she will either replace it or pay the cost of the book at the prevailing market price.
- The librarian is authorised to terminate the membership of any borrower if he/she is found guilty of misbehavior.
- Use of mobile is strictly prohibited in the library.
- Library card is necessary in the library premises.
- All the library books are required to be returned as per specified date.
- Internet access is available in the library only for academic purpose.
- Students are prohibited from exchanging library cards.
- Loss of library card should be reported to the librarian immediately.
- Library OPAC (Catalogue) is available on internet on all the computers in the college. Students can check the list of library books / CD's / journals anytime between 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. in college premises.

BEST, S.T. AND RAILWAY CONCESSIONS:

Bonafide students of the college (Male students) below 25 years of age and all female students can avail the facility for railway concession for their season tickets between the station nearest to their homes (Home address as mentioned in the admission form only) and the station nearest to the college (Parel/Curry Road/Elphinstone/Lower Parel/Sewri).

Long journey railway concession will be granted only in vacations according to rules published by the railway, details about which are available in the college office.

Application for ST bus concession is available (ST office), if permanent address is mentioned in the college admission form.

COLLEGE RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Students joining the college must note that they are under the governance of the Principal in all matters.
2. Student should behave in an orderly and disciplined manner inside and outside the institution. Disciplinary action will be taken for any reported misbehavior.
3. On admission, student will be issued identity card. Student will not be allowed for Lectures, Practicals, College Office, Laboratories, Canteen, etc. without the identity card, which should be produced on demand made by any competent authority. Failure to observe this rule will lead to cancellation of admission.
4. Minimum 75% attendance per term in lectures, tutorials and practicals is **COMPULSORY**.
5. All college examinations are **COMPULSORY**.
6. Prior permission of the Principal must be obtained to form a society, make collections, sell tickets, arrange meetings, invite guests, organize excursion and picnics etc. All notices put up on the notice board must have prior permission of the Principal.
7. Any matter published in the magazine must have prior permission of the Principal.
8. Student must refrain from any political activity within the college campus.
9. Students should not communicate any information to the press without the permission of the Principal.
10. Students are strictly prohibited from loitering in the corridors while lectures, practicals and tutorials are in progress. In case the Students are free from their respective lectures/practicals they should keep themselves engaged in the Students Common Room or Library or Gymkhana.
11. Absence from college should be intimated to the teacher incharge on time. Medical leave application should be attached with a medical certificate and medical fitness certificate when a student resumes classes.
12. Ragging is prohibited.

13. Open day attendance is compulsory for students and their parent / guardian.
14. SMOKING, USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS, DRUGS & USE OF MOBILE IS STRICTLY PROHIBITED IN THE COLLEGE campus.
15. A student may be expelled by the Principal for the following reasons (Principles laid down by Maharashtra State Government Education Department)
 - A. Persistent insubordination.
 - B. Misbehavior.
 - C. Malpractice in the examination.
 - D. Unauthorized alteration of the Leaving Certificate.
 - E. Undesirable influence over fellow student.
 - F. Involved in the immoral acts such as theft, indecent behaviour towards fellow students, etc.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

The following rules of discipline need to be observed.

- (1) Regularity in attendance and implicit obedience.
- (2) Politeness and courtesy of speech, in conduct as well as cleanliness of dress and person.
- (3) Ragging in any form is a serious offence punishable by law under the Maharashtra Anti-Ragging Act. Students who tease, bully, fight or otherwise behave in a manner that causes another student harm will be punished.

ANTI RAGGING CELL

The College has an Anti-Ragging Squad and Anti-Ragging Committee. Ragging is totally banned in the college. Ragging would be met with exemplary punishment. A student found guilty of ragging earlier will not be admitted. The college strictly follows all the regulations as mentioned in the **“UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”**. All students will give an undertaking that he or she is aware of the law regarding prohibition of ragging as well as the punishments, and that he/she if found guilty of the offence of ragging and /or abetting ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. A similar undertaking shall be taken from the parents that they are also aware of the law in this regard.

Students and parents are informed that ragging is banned and shall be considered as a serious offence which will attract severe punishment. Parents are requested to emphasize on their wards the seriousness of the offence and instruct them not to indulge in ragging.

UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS, 2009 (under section 26 (1) (g) of the University Grants Commission Act, 1956).

Important aspects of the Regulation are given below:

1. What constitutes Ragging : Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:
 - a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;
 - b) indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
 - c) asking any students to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which as the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;
 - d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
 - e) exploring the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
 - f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;

- g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student.
2. **Action to be taken by the Head of the Institution :** On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti-Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of Institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty fours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions mentioned in the **“UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”**.
3. **Administrative action in the event of ragging :** The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure mentioned in the **“UGC Regulations on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009”**.

RIGHT TO INFORMATION ACT

The Hon. Secretary of M.D.E.S. **Ms. Sonia Gandhioke** is the **Appellant Officer**, Principal **Dr. Ms. T. P. Ghule** is the **Information Officer** and Registrar **Mr. Ajay S. Rane** is the **Assistant Information Officer** to provide the necessary information under the RTI Act.
