 - 9. WHENEVER OBJECTIVES WERE ACHIEVED (GIVE DETAILS): Yes the investigators could identify the psychodynamics behind incest. Many of the victims reported that early childhood abuse was a reason for adult incest behavior.
 - 10. ACHIEVEMENTS FROM THE PROJECT: Incest as a pathology was better understood & correlation between incest & Homosexuality was determined.
 - 11. SUMMARY OF THE FINDINGS (IN 500 WORDS) 31% of the sample reported sexual abuse in childhood and having been victims of incest in the Mumbai sample. In the gay sample the percentage was higher, 16% reported Physical abuse, & 33% reported sexual abuse, while 21% reported multiple abuses. In 25% of the cases the abuser was a parent, and in 53% of the cases the abuser was a close relative. The place of abuse was their own house in 60% of the cases while 25% indicated neighbors or relative's houses as the place of abuse. Feelings. The memory of the abuse was in the form of images, thoughts and dreams; they felt like hurting themselves or the abuser. Of embarrassment, guilt, humiliation and anger were the major emotional reactions, while avoidance of the places and people were

behavioral reactions. A majority of the population reported psychological issues such as depression, anxiety, Phobia, and OCD. Finally the abused report that the abuse has tarnished their marriage, career & friendship.

Chapter-5

Conclusion & Suggestions

Analysis of the data brings to fore the following conclusions from this study.

- 1) 33% of the sample has reported sexual abuse and having been victims of incest in Mumbai city. However the percentage was higher in the gay sample as expected by the researcher.16% of the sample have indicated physical abuse, 33% have indicated emotional abuse and 21% of the gay sample have indicated a multiple of abuses. The findings of this researcher seem to be very much inline with the study done by a NGO prayas, nationwide as reported in DNA dated March 14th 2007.
- 2) In 25% of the sample the abuser was a parent, while in 53% of the cases the abuser was a close relative.
- 3) 60% of the sample have indicated their own house as the place of abuse, while 25% have indicated their neighbors house and the remaining have indicated their relatives house.
- 4) Feelings of embarrassment, guilt, humiliation and anger are high in the abused population, with thoughts of avoiding activities, places and people that remind them of the incest.
- 5) The memory of the abuse has been in the form of images, thoughts and dreams. Most of those abused have felt like hurting themselves or the abuser. Some have just been too shocked to feel anything at all.
- 6) 56% of those who were abused have just accepted the whole issue as something that has happened to them, while 13% have

thought of legal action or taking revenge. This could be attributed to the Indian social and cultural scene which does not encourage discussions such issues.

- 7) A majority of the sample have reported psychological problems such as depression, anxiety, phobia and obsessive-compulsive disorders following the incest. In the gay sample a multiple of psychological reactions are noted.
- 8) Most of the sample has reported that the abuse has had a negative consequence on their marriage, career and friendship.

We could therefore conclude that Incest is prevalent to a large extent in society and that it has a negative impact on the psyche, and life of the abused.

Suggestions for further study

- 1) A comparative study between rural and urban sample should be undertaken.
- 2) An in depth study on the cultural connotation of incest should be analysed.
- 3) An extensive study on the sexual orientation of abused children should be undertaken.
- <u>4)</u> Impact of REBT(Rational Emotive Behavioral therapy and EMDR could be studied.
